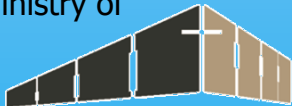

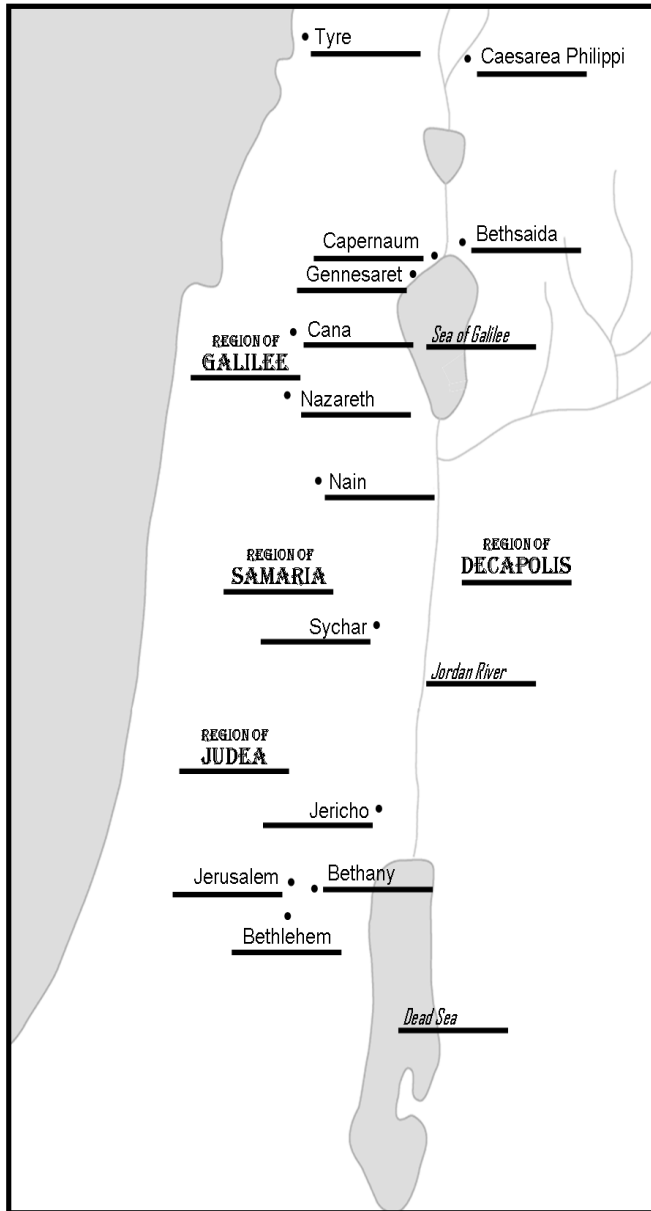

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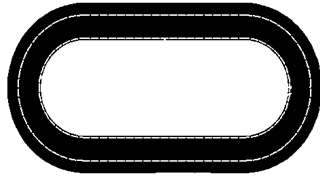
Jump Rope

- We will be using a 9 foot lightweight jump rope
- You may use any style of jump (two foot, one foot, “rocker step” etc)
- You will have two minutes to jump (total jumps counted, not total consecutive)



220 Yard Dash

- Run 220 yards (1/8th mile)



Soccer Shootout

- Competitors will be given 2 targets of different sizes at which to kick. One target will be 4ft wide, the other target 2ft wide.
- The large target is worth 1 point, the smaller target is worth 3 points.
 - 1st-2nd grade will kick from 10ft away
 - 3rd-4th grade will kick from 15ft away
 - 5th-6th grade will kick from 20ft away
- Competitors will have two minutes to score as many points as they can
- Competitors must retrieve their own ball and return to their kick point before their next kick
- Soccer balls will be size 4

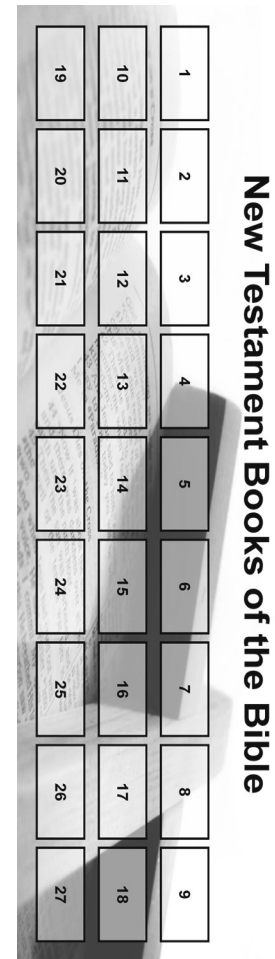

Ring Toss Relay

- Three to five team members will compete in this event

- Once the competitor has landed a ring, they return to the next start line to tag the next competitor



Basketball Shoot Relay

- Three to five team members will compete in this event
- Every made shot is worth one point
- One team member will compete at a time in relay fashion
- Competitors will dribble the length of the floor and shoot until they make a shot
- Competitors will then dribble back down the length of the floor and **hand** the ball to the next competitor (they may NOT pass the ball)
- The relay will last for 3 minutes, the team will make as many points as they can in that time span

- Competitors may continue quoting as far as they can, even if they skip words phrases or verses
- A verse is considered “quoted” if it is 90% correct and no phrases were left out or switched

2 Timothy Study Guide

- 1:1 Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, according to the promise of life which is in Christ Jesus,
- 1:2 To Timothy, my dearly beloved son: Grace, mercy, and peace, from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.
- 1:3 I thank God, whom I serve from my forefathers with pure conscience, that without ceasing I have remembrance of thee in my prayers night and day;
- 1:4 Greatly desiring to see thee, being mindful of thy tears, that I may be filled with joy;
- 1:5 When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy grandmother Lois, and thy mother Eunice; and I am persuaded that in thee also.
- 1:6 Wherefore I put thee in remembrance that thou stir up the gift of God, which is in thee by the putting on of my hands.
- 1:7 For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.
- 1:8 Be not thou therefore ashamed of the testimony of our Lord, nor of me his prisoner: but be thou partaker of the afflictions of the gospel according to the power of God;
- 1:9 Who hath saved us, and called us with an holy calling, not according to our works, but according to his own purpose and grace, which was given us in Christ Jesus before the world began,

- 1:10 But is now made manifest by the appearing of our Saviour Jesus Christ, who hath abolished death, and hath brought life and immortality to light through the gospel:
- 1:11 Whereunto I am appointed a preacher, and an apostle, and a teacher of the Gentiles.
- 1:12 For the which cause I also suffer these things: nevertheless I am not ashamed: for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day.
- 1:13 Hold fast the form of sound words, which thou hast heard of me, in faith and love which is in Christ Jesus.
- 1:14 That good thing which was committed unto thee keep by the Holy Ghost which dwelleth in us.
- 1:15 This thou knowest, that all they which are in Asia be turned away from me; of whom are Phygellus and Hermogenes.
- 1:16 The Lord give mercy unto the house of Onesiphorus; for he oft refreshed me, and was not ashamed of my chain:
- 1:17 But, when he was in Rome, he sought me out very diligently, and found me.
- 1:18 The Lord grant unto him that he may find mercy of the Lord in that day: and in how many things he ministered unto me at Ephesus, thou knowest very well.
- 2:1 Thou therefore, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus.
- 2:2 And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also.
- 2:3 Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.
- 2:4 No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier.
- 2:5 And if a man also strive for masteries, yet is he not crowned, except he strive lawfully.
- 2:6 The husbandman that laboreth must be first partaker of the fruits.

- 2:7 Consider what I say; and the Lord give thee understanding in all things.
- 2:8 Remember that Jesus Christ of the seed of David was raised from the dead according to my gospel:
- 2:9 Wherein I suffer trouble, as an evil doer, even unto bonds; but the word of God is not bound.
- 2:10 Therefore I endure all things for the elect's sakes, that they may also obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory.
- 2:11 It is a faithful saying: For if we be dead with him, we shall also live with him:
- 2:12 If we suffer, we shall also reign with him: if we deny him, he also will deny us:
- 2:13 If we believe not, yet he abideth faithful: he cannot deny himself.
- 2:14 Of these things put them in remembrance, charging them before the Lord that they strive not about words to no profit, but to the subverting of the hearers.
- 2:15 Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.
- 2:16 But shun profane and vain babblings: for they will increase unto more ungodliness.
- 2:17 And their word will eat as doth a canker: of whom is Hymenaeus and Philetus;
- 2:18 Who concerning the truth have erred, saying that the resurrection is past already; and overthrow the faith of some.
- 2:19 Nevertheless the foundation of God standeth sure, having this seal, The Lord knoweth them that are his. And, Let every one that nameth the name of Christ depart from iniquity.
- 2:20 But in a great house there are not only vessels of gold and of silver, but also of wood and of earth; and some to honour, and some to dishonour.
- 2:21 If a man therefore purge himself from these, he shall be a vessel unto honour, sanctified, and meet for the master's use, and prepared unto every good work.

- 2:22 Flee also youthful lusts: but follow righteousness, faith, charity, peace, with them that call on the Lord out of a pure heart.
- 2:23 But foolish and unlearned questions avoid, knowing that they do gender strifes.
- 2:24 And the servant of the Lord must not strive; but be gentle unto all men, apt to teach, patient,
- 2:25 In meekness instructing those that oppose themselves; if God peradventure will give them repentance to the acknowledging of the truth;
- 2:26 And that they may recover themselves out of the snare of the devil, who are taken captive by him at his will.
- 3:1 This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come.
- 3:2 For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy,

- 3:9 But they shall proceed no further: for their folly shall be manifest unto all men, as theirs also was.
- 3:10 But thou hast fully known my doctrine, manner of life, purpose, faith, longsuffering, charity, patience,
- 3:11 Persecutions, afflictions, which came unto me at Antioch, at Iconium, at Lystra; what persecutions I endured: but out of them all the Lord delivered me.

Instrumental Competition

- Competitors may play any sacred piece.
- Only a piano is provided for competition, competitors must bring their own instrument if any other than a piano is required .
- Competitors **MUST** provide a copy of the music for the judges, so that they can follow along. (If it is an original composition, then the competitor must provide an outline of what will happen in the song, such as key changes, which songs are included, etc).

- 3:12 Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution.
- 3:13 But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived.
- 3:14 But continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them;
- 3:15 And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.
- 3:16 All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:
- 3:17 That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works.

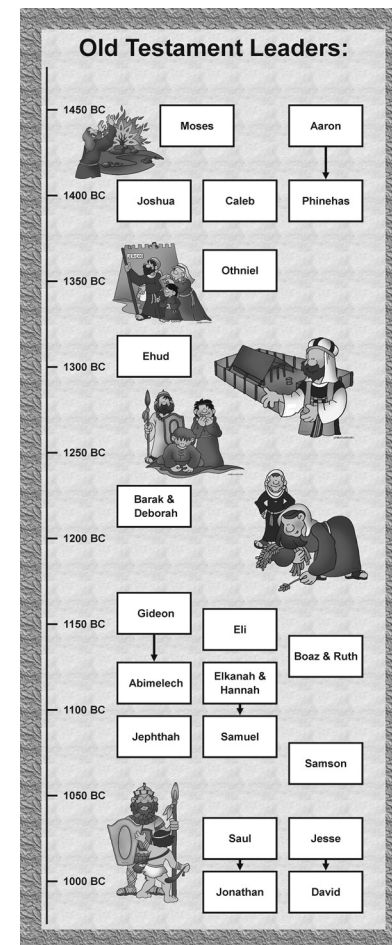

- 4:12 And Tychicus have I sent to Ephesus.
- 4:13 The cloke that I left at Troas with Carpus, when thou comest, bring with thee, and the books, but especially the parchments.

- Jephthah- A judge who made a foolish vow to sacrifice his daughter
- Samuel- A small boy in the temple who heard God's voice; Became the last judge of Israel before they had a king
- Samson- God gave extraordinary strength to defeat the Philistines; He did not serve God, and died as a captive
- Saul- First king of Israel; Disobeyed God, and the kingdom was taken away from his sons
- Jesse- Prominent farmer in Bethlehem; Father of David
- Jonathan- Son of King Saul; Valiant warrior; Friend of David
- David- Defeated the giant Goliath; Second king of Israel; Called "A man after God's own heart"

Old Testament Leaders Study Guide

- Moses- Led the Children of Israel out of slavery in Egypt
- Aaron- Brother of Moses; First high priest of Israel
- Joshua- Led Israel into the Promised Land after Moses' death
- Caleb- One of the twelve spies of Israel; Believed God and lived to enter the Promise Land
- Phinehas- Son of Aaron who became high priest; Very fervent for the Lord
- Othniel- Nephew of Caleb; The first "judge" of Israel; Delivered Israel from the king of Mesopotamia
- Ehud- Judge in Israel; Delivered Israel from Eglon, King of Moab
- Barak & Deborah- A lady judge and a military captain who defeated Sisera and his army
- Gideon- Deafeated the Midianite army of 135,000 with only 300 men
- Eli- The high priest who raised Samuel, the prophet
- Boaz- A righteous man who married Ruth; Was the great grandfather of David
- Abimelech- One of sons of Gideon; Killed his brothers to make himself king; Was killed by a stone falling on his head
- Elkanah & Hannah- Godly parents of Samuel, the prophet

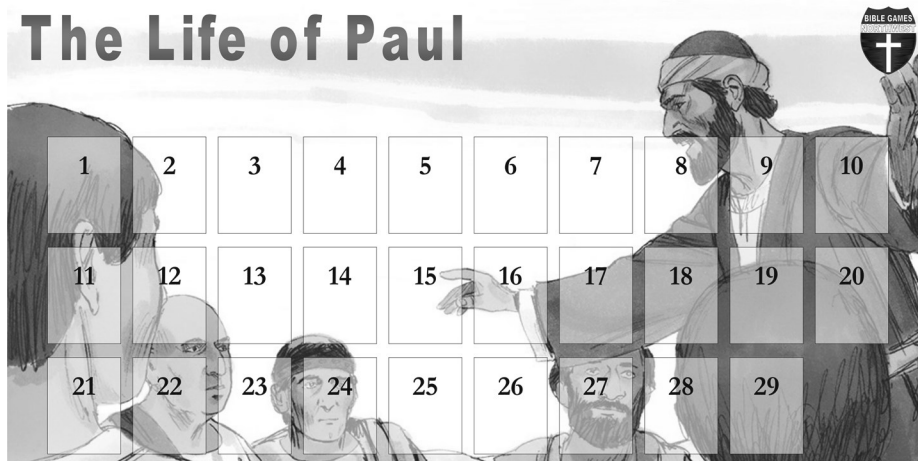

And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God: Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints;

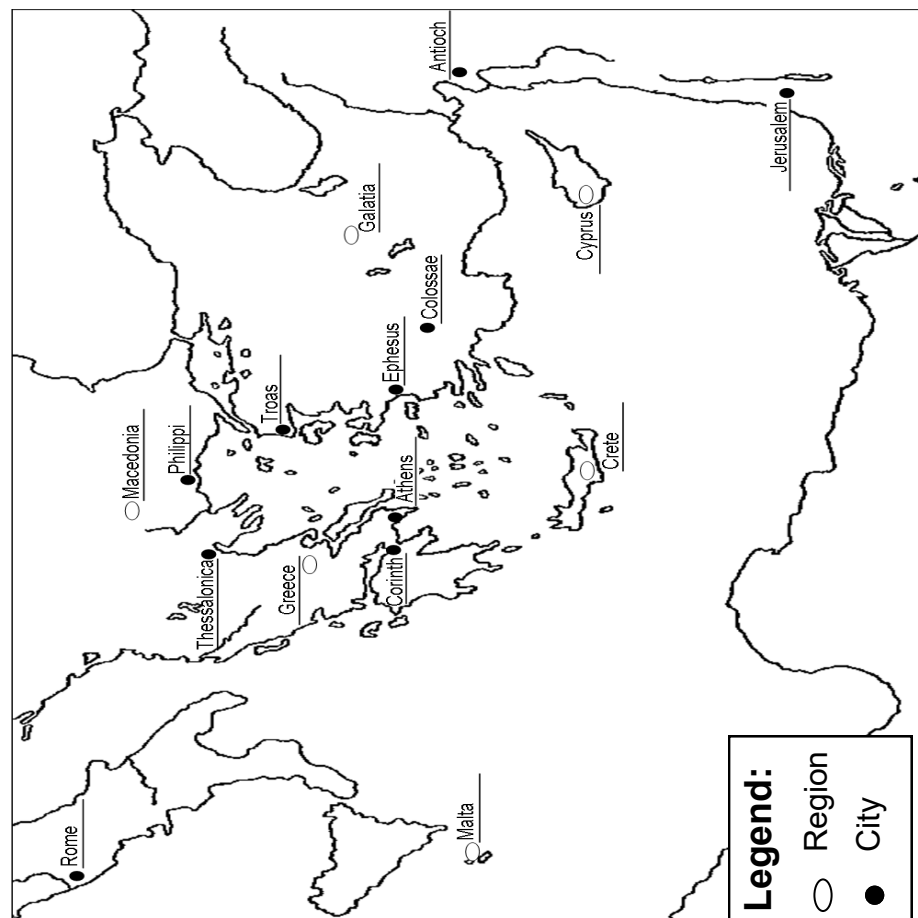

Romans 12:9-18 Let love be without dissimulation. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good. Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another; Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord; Rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer; Distributing to the necessity of saints; given to hospitality. Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep. Be of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate. Be not wise in your own conceits. Recompense to no man evil for evil. Provide things honest in the sight of all men. If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men.

2 Peter 1:5-8 And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity. For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.
